#### Cedar Lake 2019

The Town Beaches on Cedar Lake are scheduled to be open for the 2019 season from <u>June 13 through</u> <u>August 19</u>, 10:30am until 6:00pm. Hours may vary according to staff availability, training, weather, or special programs. Access to the Town parks, including the beaches on Cedar Lake, is by permit only. Non-resident passes are available at Pelletier Park during operating hours for \$75 per household. Chester residents may enter staffed facilities by showing a driver's license, or other proof of residency or taxpayer status with identification. <u>Groups of 10 or more must make reservations in advance</u> and provide a certificate of liability insurance.

Watercraft\* is not permitted at Pelletier Park while lifeguards are on duty. For access to Cedar Lake please use alternate launch areas at the Town Beach across from Lakeview Avenue or the State Boat Launch on Bishop Road

\*including – but not limited to – kayaks, canoes, paddle boards, row boats, and inflatables

# If your child is in the water you should be too! ALL NONSWIMMERS MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY AN ADULT WHO IS STANDING WITHIN ONE ARMS LENGTH.

With the opening of Cedar Lake the Parks and Recreation Department would like to remind parents to please watch your children while they are in the water and do not leave them unattended at the facility. Drowning is the second leading cause of trauma deaths for ages 1-19 years old and the third leading cause of ALL deaths of children 0-4 years of age. There are 3,533 fatal (non-boating related) drownings annually in the United States. *This is about 10 drowning deaths per day*.

We would like all patrons to realize that no one is permitted in the water if they are under the influence of drugs or alcohol, or while they are chewing gum or eating.

<u>Among adolescents and adults, alcohol use is involved in up to</u>

70% of deaths associated with water recreation.

Please remember that head first entries are not permitted at our swimming facilities.

<u>This includes throwing children into the water.</u>

Head-first entries are the leading cause of sports related spinal injuries.





Fishing!

Please do not fish in the swimming areas, even in the off-season. We do not wish to have hooks in swimmers' feet!

#### Cedar Lake

The Town of Chester owns Cedar Lake and maintains two public beaches on its shores. The area of the lake is about 80 acres and is fed by two springs and two inlet streams with outflow into the Pattaconk Brook. The lake is about 60 feet deep in the middle. The Town owns approximately one third of the shore. Another third is owned by Camp Hazen YMCA. The remainder is private residences and State owned property, including a boat launch. Chester's main beach, on West Main Street, has a 50,000 square foot swimming area that is as

deep as 20 feet in one corner during the spring. The park at the shore is named *Robert H. Pelletier Park* in memory of the Chester resident who was the Head Lifeguard for more than two decades. The park area is 0.7 acres and includes seasonal lifeguard coverage, picnic tables, a pavilion, grills, and a food concession. The smaller waterfront facility is located on Cedar Lake Road and was named *Lake View Park* in 2012. It is unstaffed and has no designated swimming area. The beaches require patrons to have a permit. Details and prices may be found on the <u>PARK FEE SCHEDULE</u> link at chesterct.org.



#### **DOG OWNERS!**

Please abide by the statutes of our State and ordinances of our Town.

Dogs are not permitted on playgrounds or beach parks, except guide dogs.

Dogs in other areas of the parks must be controlled by a leash.

Dogs may not roam on the property.

Any waste material deposited by your dog must be removed before leaving the immediate area.

#### Parker's Point Boat Launch



This .6 acre boat launch facility is located at the end of Parker's Point Road on the Connecticut River. It offers boat trailer parking and a picnic area with a beautiful view. The shore is a favorite winter eagle viewing location. A permit is required for parking. Details and prices may be found on the <a href="PARKFEE SCHEDULE">PARKFEE SCHEDULE</a> link.

#### **Chester Creek Overlook**

The overlook is a .4 acre waterfront spot with a deck, seating area, and parking lot on the Chester Creek, just a stone's throw from the Connecticut River. It is located at the end of Railroad Avenue. The Town dock at the overlook houses marine rescue watercraft.



# NORTH QUARTER PARK IS UNDER RENOVATION. Areas of the park and playground may be closed throughout the year.

#### **North Quarter Park**

North Quarter Park is a 22 acre, multi-use facility, located at the corner of Main Street and Middlesex Avenue. It includes a playground, picnic area, and multi-use fields in a wooded setting. The northern section of the park has a well-maintained .5 mile nature trail loop. The end of the trail offers beautiful views of the wildlife and habitat of the Chester Creek. A variety of water fowl, birds, and vegetation can be seen along the trail and in the creek.

# New Helmet Law took effect on October 1, 2018.

Public Act No. 18-167 expands the types of activities during which children under age 16 must wear protective headgear and *adds parks* to the places where such headgear must be worn. In addition to wearing a helmet when riding a <u>Bicycle</u>, the new statute also includes skateboarding, nonmotorized scootering, roller skating, and in-line skating

#### L'hommedieu Park

This old mill site is located on Spring Street, along the Pattaconk Brook. It is a peaceful setting with a dam, rushing waters, a picnic table, and views of Mallards, Wood Ducks, Great Blue Heron, and beavers. A historic narrative is located in the park.

# **Chester Elementary School Baseball Fields**

Three baseball fields are maintained by the Parks and Recreation Department at Chester Elementary School, on Ridge Road. The property was originally donated to the Town in 1928 by Jessie C. Bates, Hilton C. Brooks, and William P. Holden for athletic fields. The fields or any park above, may be available for group usage of 10 or more, by submitting the <u>Group Use for Unstaffed Parks</u> form.

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# REGISTRATION INFORMATION

Welcome to the Chester Parks and Recreation 2019 Children's Summer Camp Program.

PLEASE READ and SAVE this letter. It contains IMPORTANT information.

- **-Day Camp** is available to students entering grades 1 through 6, the weeks of July 8, 15, 22, 29, August 5, and 12. The weeks of July 22 and August 5 **Kinder-Camp** is available to children entering, or age eligible for (5 years old by December 31, 2019), Kindergarten. The week of July 15 is open to those entering 7<sup>th</sup> grade as well.
- -The week of June 24 is only open to campers entering grades 4 through 7. There is a \$225 registration fee the week of June 24. Three field trips are included!
- -Camp supervision is from 8:15am until 3:45pm with scheduled programming between 8:45am and 3:30pm. Registration is limited to 42 children per one-week session (a combined total of 54 during the weeks of Kinder-Camp) for a fee of \$140. Except where noted on the calendar, the camp meets at Chester Elementary School on Mondays, Thursdays, and severe weather days and Cedar Lake on Tuesdays and Wednesdays, with field trips leaving from Chester Elementary on Fridays. *Please review the calendar carefully as there are several exceptions to the locations this summer.*
- -Children are accepted in the order in which the <u>completed registration form and cash or check payment made payable to "Chester Parks and Recreation"</u>, or a credit card payment made on our website, are received by the Director of Parks and Recreation. *Please add \$5 per week if paying by charge card using the PayPal "Donate" button on the Parks and Recreation web page at <a href="http://chesterct.org/town-government/parks-recreation-commission/">http://chesterct.org/town-government/parks-recreation-commission/</a> Weekly rates are not prorated for absences. Please return the registration, <i>WITH THE FEE*, to Chester Elementary School, *or* place the registration in the Parks and Recreation mailbox, in the second floor lobby of the Town Hall, *or* scan and e-mail to <a href="mailto:parkrec@chesterct.org">parkrec@chesterct.org</a> or mail to:

- \*If you require a receipt, please indicate this on your registration form and provide an e-mail address.
- -Refunds, less a \$20 processing fee, per child, per week, will be given by October 1 ONLY if a child is withdrawn, by written request, no later than three weeks before the session they are registered for begins. A change in session may be made at no charge if space is available. Another child may not be sent in place of the child registered.
- -Please do not leave children before the scheduled camp hours. Children who arrive early, or are not picked up on time, may be withdrawn from the program.
- -Children who are disruptive, or cannot adapt to the program, may be withdrawn. Bullying and harassment are not tolerated in our program.
- -Please escort your children to the check-in table when they arrive. Check-in is between 8:15 and 8:45am. It will take place inside Chester Elementary School during inclement weather.

- -A parent or authorized adult must come to the staff table to sign their child out with the program supervisor, including after field trips. Only adults authorized on your child's registration form or by written permission may pick up your child. If the staff does not recognize the individual photo identification will be required. Please sign your child out between 3:30 and 3:45pm. Children may not enter the parking lot until they are signed out.
- -Children are welcome to arrive late or leave early. Please notify a staff member when you bring your child late or pick them up early.
- -Children who walk or ride their bikes home may sign themselves out, with <u>written</u> permission from their parent or guardian.
- -Children who are not registered in the program are not permitted at the facilities unless accompanied by an adult, while camp is in session. Adults and children not registered in the program may not use the camp section at Cedar Lake during program hours. Children may not bring guests to the program. Adults not employed by the Town of Chester may not participate in the program, unless approved by the Chester Park and Recreation Commission.
- -PLEASE DRESS APPROPRIATELY FOR THE WEATHER. It may be much cooler at Cedar Lake than other areas of Town.
- -We seldom change the location of the program, but in the event of forecasted SEVERE WEATHER the program will meet inside Chester Elementary School. Outdoor field trips may be rescheduled in the event of severe weather. Moves from the lake to the school will be announced by 7:45am on the Parks and Recreation voice mail message at 860-526-0013, extension 223 and via e-mail.
- -If severe weather occurs while the children are at Cedar Lake First Student will transport them to Chester Elementary by school bus. A message will be left on 860-526-0013, extension 223 if we move mid-day. In unusual situations please have an emergency, early pick-up plan. The staff cannot transport children.

### -BRING A <u>WATER BOTTLE</u>, SNACK, LUNCH, AND BEVERAGES EVERY DAY.

- -A lunch package may be purchased from the concession the days camp is held at Cedar Lake. Camp supervisors will take orders and collect lunch money at morning check-in on the day of the purchase. Children do not visit the concession, themselves, during the day. Menus will be available the first day of each session.
- -Sandals may be worn <u>only</u> on beach days. <u>Shoes that are appropriate for hiking in the woods and playing sports</u> are needed every other day. Please wear play-clothes that may get <u>wet or stained</u>.
- -Do not allow children to bring money to the program, including the days at Cedar Lake and field trips. We wish to avoid unpleasant situations with lost money and borrowing or loaning misunderstandings.
- -The Director of Parks and Recreation is available at 8:15am at the Program, each morning. You may also leave a message regarding your questions or concerns at 860-526-0013, extension 223. The phone number for the Camp cell phone is 860-790-0133. You may also call the Lifeguards' phone at 860-790-0124 when the program meets at Cedar Lake.
- -Swimming Lessons, for no additional charge, are held on the weeks of July 22 and August 5 for all Kinder-Camp and grade 1 children the days the program meets at the lake.

#### **WE ROUTINELY POST PHOTOS!**

-Our staff or local newspapers may photograph children in the program. If you do not wish your child's name or photograph to appear in a newspaper, on the Town web site, in Parks and Recreation program flyers, social media, or e-mails, or on bulletin boards, please write on the top of your registration form the restrictions for public posting of your child's name and/or photograph.

Schedule Modifications and Field Trip Information
Children must wear RED SHIRTS and close toed, nonslip, secured shoes on all field trips.

- -The field trip on June 2 to Lake Compounce returns to the Meeting House at 4:45pm.
- -Children must <u>wear their swimsuits</u> on the field trip on *August 16* and bring a towel. We bring our own certified lifeguards on field trips.
- -Drop-off and pick-up for the field trips on *June 27, July 24 and August 9* are at Cedar Lake. Please provide a swimsuit for your child for swimming at the lake following the field trip.
- -Please bring a <u>water bottle</u>, <u>beverages</u>, <u>snack</u>, and <u>lunch</u>, in a <u>backpack on every Field Trip</u>. The bus leaves promptly at 8:45am. DO NOT SEND MONEY on field trips. The registration fee covers all costs. We do not stop at gift shops or snack bars. Children must be able to carry their own belongings on field trips.

#### **Medication and Sunscreen**

- **-Sunscreen** may not be sufficient protection for every child. Please provide the camp staff with written instructions if you wish your child to wear a hat or shirt all day, or if you wish them to keep any articles of clothing on while in the water.
- -Please apply your child's first daily application of a topical medication or sunscreen before they arrive at the program.
- -The staff <u>applies sunscreen at 11:45am and 1:45pm</u> to children who have a completed <u>authorization</u> form. The Camp will notify parents of the brand of sunscreen we are using the first day the session meets. These application times follow our first two swimming activity periods when we meet at Cedar Lake. Dismissal follows the third swimming activity period.
- -Those who wish their child to have a particular brand of sunscreen may complete the authorization form and submit the sunscreen indicated on the form. The staff will apply the provided sunscreen accordingly.
- -According to the Connecticut State Statutes <u>Topical over-the-counter medications</u> do not need a physician's order, but <u>do require a parent or guardian to complete an authorization form</u>. This includes *sunscreen* and *insect repellant*.
- -According to the Connecticut State Statutes your child's physician must complete a medication authorization for each <u>prescription and oral over-the-counter medication</u> that you wish our staff to administer, or you may bring them to our site at the time your child needs them and administer them yourself.
- -Bring the <u>completed authorization form(s)</u>, <u>with the medication</u>, to the program the first day it is needed. *Please do not mail in advance.*
