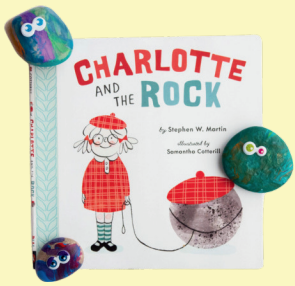
April 11: Session 2: Irlen Syndrome

Irlen Syndrome is not an optical problem, but rather a problem with the brain’s ability to process visual information. This syndrome affects 14% of the general population, and 46% of individuals with existing reading or learning difficulties. Julie will discuss what Irlen Syndrome is, how it is identified in children, and how parents and teachers can help readers who are affected by Irlen syndrome.

Join us in the afternoon to watch a 2023 comedy musical fantasy film that tells the origin story of a familiar character in children’s literature. Popcorn will be provided.

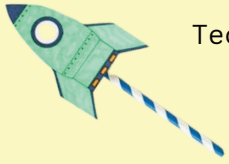
